- Citizenship in an EU Member State
- Proficiency in English
- Minimum of a bachelor's degree (students), or a PhD degree (scholars)
- Academic excellence, or outstanding personal or professional background
- Academic or professional experience of 3+ months in two or more EU Member States is recommended
