

Notification obligation and quarantine in case of suspected infection with the coronavirus

Recommendations of the Ministry of Education, Science and Culture Mecklenburg-Vorpommern

<p>Symptoms if you have symptoms such as fever, cough, sore throat, colds, diarrhoea, breathing problems, etc.</p>	1
<p>Contact with infected persons if you have had personal contact within the past 14 days with a person who has been diagnosed with SARS-CoV-2</p>	2
<p>Return from risk areas - International if you enter the country within the last 14 days from an area which is currently classified as a risk area by the Robert Koch Institute</p>	3
<p>Return from particularly affected areas - National if you come back within the last 14 days from an area that is currently classified as "particularly affected" by the Robert Koch Institute</p>	4

Reasonable suspicion according to Robert Koch Institute

<p>Return from risk areas and symptoms of disease if you enter the country within the last 14 days from an area which is currently classified as a risk area by the Robert Koch Institute and have symptoms</p>	5
<p>Contact with infected persons and symptoms if you have had personal contact within the past 14 days with a person who has been diagnosed with SARS-CoV-2 and has symptoms</p>	6

1. You are obliged to contact your doctor by telephone. There you will receive information on the further course of treatment.
2. You are obliged to go into 14-day domestic quarantine. Returning to campus is only possible if you present a negative test for the SARS CoV 2 virus or freedom from symptoms.
